- \$29,850 in emergency repair funds has been approved and is being spent on Pump Station #2 within the Sewer District. Repairs have begun and are scheduled for completion the first week of October. Sewer line residents continue to be surveyed for water usage.
- Discover Germantown II takes place 10/24 from 10 am to 3 pm. It includes a book sale and mini farmers market in the Library parking lot, and an open house and Lions Club Apple Festival at the newly-restored Central House. Businesses along Palatine Park Rd. and within the Hamlet area are invited to participate.
- The Germantown Garden Club's 2010 Calendar, full of historic facts and photos, is on sale for \$15 at locations around town and directly from the Club.
- The Highway Department is now on winter hours (7 am – 3:30 pm). Docks at the Anchorage will be removed from the River in late October.
- The Cub Scout Pancake Breakfast is 10/18 at the Kellner Community Youth & Activities Building. The Cub Scouts' canned food drive is 11/7 to 11/14.
- A Business Roundtable meeting takes place 7 pm on 9/24 at the Town Hall. River Street Planning & Development will facilitate the meeting.
- Assemblyman Pete Lopez will be at a Roundtable Meeting for Germantown, Clermont and Livingston, at the Town Hall at 7 pm on 10/1.
- The 2010 Budget Workshops will be held on 10/8, 10/13, 10/20, 10/27. The public may attend, but not participate. The public may speak at a formal Budget Hearing, taking place after the Workshops.
- The Columbia County Golden Gathering, with State Senator Saland and the Office for the Aging, takes place 10/17, 9:30 am -12:30 pm at Columbia Green Community College. Flu shots will be available at this event and on 10/13 at Livingston Town Hall. New flu shots for the H1N1 flu will be announced soon.
