



Bruce Bohnsack advised that the Comprehensive Plan central findings are available at the Town Hall and there is a meeting on Saturday in the Activities Building. He would like to have a workshop with the board to give an in-depth report, things are moving along and he expects to have it to the board by the end of April.

The Web Site Committee said the website design is 90% completed.

The Town Application Fees Committee will submit their suggestions at next month's town board meeting. The resolution has been passed to allow them to raise the rates, which have had no increases since 1989.

Supervisor Brown said a letter had been sent to Governor Spitzer's office regarding the air monitoring device and they will forward the information to Department of Environmental Conservation.

The Revitalization Committee will meet on April 11<sup>th</sup>.

Supervisor Brown reported on the sidewalks and said the next step is to find out what needs to happen to actually get the grant monies; there is a meeting on the requirements to manage the grant and Supervisor Brown will be going.

Jason Clum reported that the Park Commission has been reorganizing itself with their main concern being the Youth Activities Program and the July 4<sup>th</sup> event. The meeting schedule has been adjusted to accommodate members' schedules, with quarterly meetings and monthly sub-committee meetings for specific functions.

April 2<sup>nd</sup> there will be a Quarterly meeting and anyone interested should contact the Town Hall.

Mr. Schiff stated he had heard that the Restaurant on Church Avenue was closing due to the sewer rent increase and questioned the procedures to establish sewer rates for businesses. He wants the board to take this into account for future Germantown expansion.

Supervisor Brown said the sewer law doesn't allow for differences in rates, it's based on seats and number of bathrooms. He said the owner of the business had been advised about the grievance procedure but hasn't utilized the process and efforts to reach out to the owner haven't been successful.

Mr. Overrington mentioned the recent accident near the school and said he would like the sidewalk to be on the school side of the road, and would like the board to consider his request.
